AMSTERDAM TO BRUGES - OR BRUGES TO AMSTERDAM











You'll travel from Amsterdam to Bruges or from Bruges to Amsterdam on your luxury hotel barge. The ship docks at a colorful series of ports and some of the excursions from these will be carried out by bus. Some will also be by canal boat, on foot or, if you wish, by bike. Occasionally, your tour guide will take you on an after-dinner walk, to give you a feeling of what life in these medieval towns was like.

You enjoy many delicious breakfasts, lunches, and dinners while sailing to your next destination, but there will also be plenty of opportunity to try the specialties of local eateries! And lectures by local experts on fascinating topics will let you appreciate what you see (and taste) even more. Take Amsterdam, for example.

The best-known works of the Dutch masters of painting await you at the recently-renovated Rijksmuseum. On another occasion, your day will get off to a brilliant start in Schoonhoven, the heart of global gold and silver production and home of the Silver Museum. At Kinderdijk, you're treated to an evocative Dutch vista featuring nineteen beautiful windmills, constructed in the 18th century to pump water out of the surrounding lowlands. Dordrecht, a surprisingly unknown city, is brimming with history and has more than a thousand architectural monuments! Marvel at the architecture of the well-preserved fortified town of Willemstad. And be impressed by the ingenuity of the Dutch 'Deltaworks', an elaborate engineering project built to protect The Netherlands against flooding.





The Rubens house in Antwerp,
Belgium gives you an insight
into how the painter lived and
worked — before you visit some
of his masterpieces in the Onze
Lieve Vrouwe Cathedral. Later
on, the village of Sint Amands
awaits you for a tour of Brewery
Bosteels. Of course, a tasting is
included. You will find out why
the huge Saint Baaf's Cathedral
in Ghent takes special pride in

'The adoration of the mystic
lamb' — twelve oak wood panels
painted by the world-renowned
Van Eijck brothers. Nearby,
Ypres and the 'In Flanders Fields'
museum tell the story of the
First World War in the West
Flanders Front region. And
Westvleteren Abbey — with its
brewery — will teach you about
the life of the Sint-Sixtus monks.
Taste their alcoholic work of art





in the only café on the globe that serves the famous Westvleteren Trappist beer.

Bruges, affectionately nicknamed 'The Pearl of Flanders', draws lovers of craftsmanship to Onze Lieve Vrouwekerk church and its extensive art collection. Michelangelo's world-famous marble statue 'Madonna with Child' is considered its absolute highlight. It wouldn't be Belgium without learning how to make your own bonbons during a chocolate workshop, and you can get a culture fix from the paintings of Flemish primitives by Jan van Eyck and Hans Memling at the Groeninge Museum.

The tour takes you to highlights located both in the big cities and hidden away in a couple of smaller, lesser-known Dutch locales in between. Lectures by local experts on various subjects will tremendously enrich your experience. On this tour, you will also travel from city to city on your comfortable hotel barge, with some of the excursions taking place by bus, and others by canal boat, on foot or even, if you wish, by bike or E-bike!







HOLLAND CULTURE TOUR









What you'll see and experience





Savoring the beauty of Amsterdam is best done on foot with an excellent tour guide. We will embark on a city walk to the stunning Dutch art and history of the Rijksmuseum, where you'll see exceptional artworks by the Dutch masters. You'll also walk to the Anne Frank house. Afterwards, it's time to return to your Magnifique floating hotel by canal boat! In Haarlem (sometimes lovingly called 'Little Amsterdam') the awe-inspiring Saint Bavo's

Cathedral awaits you, ready to show off its artistic splendors and give a demonstration of its famous 30-meter-tall organ. A guided visit to the Frans Hals Museum rounds off your day.

On several days, a comfortable bus brings you to a number of sights all located close to one another. During one of these trips, you'll learn first-hand the compelling story behind the Cruquius

Museum, visit Rembrandt's
birthplace, Leiden, and
traverse the 'green heart'
of Holland. The ship awaits
you in the fortified town
of Vianen.

On another day trip, the bus takes you to The Hague. In the beautiful Mauritshuis Museum Villa you can see, among others, Vermeer's 'Girl with a Pearl Earring'. Next stop is the city of Delft with its towering 'Old and New' churches. The latter's crypt is the final resting place of many Dutch royals.

At De Candelaer company, you'll see how the typical 'Delft Blue' ceramics are made.

Nearby Rotterdam offers you also the thrill of a thirty-minute harbor tour in a fast water taxi.

Sailing into Kinderdijk is a great way of seeing its nineteen beautiful windmills, constructed in the 18th century to pump water out of the surrounding lowlands. In the pretty town of Gouda, whose name has become synonymous with cheese, you will do a walking tour and, of course, a cheese tasting. You might be pleasantly surprised if you partake in the optional bike tour (about 20 km). On Thursdays, you can visit Gouda's Market Square, area still trade their cheeses during the weekly market from April through to August. Next to the market square is the majestic, 123-meter-long Saint Jan's church, with 72 stained glass windows which depict many biblical and historical scenes.

Finally, a special treat awaits you with a visit to the flower auctions in Aalsmeer. From here, millions of flowers find their way to vases around the world. Back in Amsterdam and using the latest technology, 'THIS IS HOLLAND' lets you experience what it's like to fly across the country—including the feeling of wind in your hair, moist fog, and typical Dutch smells along the way!



Our 8-day cruise aboard the beautiful Magnifique IV takes you through some of The Netherlands' most historically significant sites where you'll learn about the period leading up to the war and occupation, the battles, the dark years of the occupation, the liberation and the long-lasting consequences of World War II.

The Magnifique IV, will follow the beautiful Rhine, Waal and Maas rivers, en route to many important historical sites that played a key role during the Second World War. One of our tour leaders will accompany you for the entire week and there will be a series of lectures by local experts that will give you rare insight into the stories that shaped World War II.

The Liberation Cruise can be taken either from Amsterdam to Maastricht or vice versa aboard the brand new Magnifique IV, your premium floating hotel and home away from home for the duration of the tour.

The ship will dock in well-known ports such as Arnhem and Roermond and your tour will continue either by bus, via canals or on foot. On board you will enjoy many delicious breakfasts, lunches and dinners, sometimes while sailing to the next destination, but there will


also be plenty of opportunities to have meals in the charming towns and bustling cities we'll be visiting, so you'll have plenty of opportunity to try local specialties.

Not only will one of our tour leaders will accompany you for the entire week, but you'll also go on a number of guided walks with local experts, which will further enrich the experience. The tour starts or ends in Amsterdam where you will discover how the inhabitants of

the city lived through the war and coped with occupation of Nazi Germany forces. During a visit to the Anne Frank House you will discover the iconic story of how a little girl experienced this horrendous time.

You'll visit Arnhem, where a local guide will show you around and tell you all about the famous, yet tragic operation Market garden where, in September 1944, the Allies planned to land thousands of paratroopers inside enemy lines, take control of a series of bridges, and have the war wrapped up by Christmas 1944.

A guided visit of the National Liberation Museum in Groesbeek is also on the program. The museum is located on the site where on September 17th 1944, the Operation Market Garden paratroopers landed.



Then there is the National War and Resistance Museum Overloon. Here, you will see how it came to be that, over a period of just five years, more than fifty million people lost their lives.

But this cruise is not only about the history of World War II. Your excursions also include free time to enjoy a little culture and leisure. In Arcen for example you may visit the enchanting castle



gardens, in Roermond you'll spend some time in the beautiful city center, and in Maastricht. the capital of the province of Limburg, you'll experience the vibrant energy of its lively center and the warmth of its hospitality.

At the end of it all, you will have heard both the harrowing, and the heart-warming, stories of the people whose lives were forever changed by this significant chapter of human history and will hopefully walk away from the experience with a new-found respect for the triumph of the

human spirit.

Guests who feel like relaxing outside can enjoy two partially-roofed sun decks, complete with comfortable chairs and tables, and a whirlpool/Jacuzzi on the top deck. Bikes (or E-bikes) are at your disposal if needed.





The interiors of the spacious twin cabins, twin premium cabins, and upper deck suites are tastefully decorated. Each has its own bathroom with shower, sink, and toilet. The premium cabins and upper deck suites also come with a small sitting area. The airconditioning and ventilation can be regulated per cabin.


In every cabin, you'll find two excellent single beds with high-quality box spring mattresses. According to your preference, the beds can be set apart from each other or pushed together. The sheets are crisp, the towels soft, and the storage space easily sufficient for your clothes and luggage.

All cabins have portholes (set shut for safety reasons) or French balconies for the upper deck suites, a flat-screen satellite TV, a small safe, and a hairdryer.

On request, an additional fold-down bed is available in some twin cabins.


